

#### RV WHEELERS GENERAL MEETING MINUTES NOVEMBER 9, 2017

Officers present included: Dee Wennerstrom; Doug Gibson; Ed Bauman; and Bruce Block. Prior to starting the meeting, various snacks, cookies, cakes and other items were provided. Thanks to Roe Noonan for organizing the delicious food and drinks. Dee started the meeting at 6:35pm. This meeting's speaker was Tim Moy, VMS Security Chief. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Bruce Block. November birthdays and wedding anniversaries were recognized. Also, all Club vets were recognized for their service to the country. Dee passed on the sad news that Ralph Yeager has died. Also, Vi Richards is now in hospice. She also passed on thanks from Vi and Rhondda Yeager for the many kind notes, visits, and phone calls. Dee thanked all the members who provided food for tonight. Eight meeting guests were recognized.

Doug presented a display of pictures showing the Canadian Rockies and how the glaciers in these mountains have been decreasing over time. Doug also thanked members for bringing soda can pop-tops for donation to the Loma Linda Ronald McDonald House charity. Our Club continues to support this charity by collecting poptops.

Doug introduced the members of the 2018 Club Officers nominating committee. The nominations for 2018 Officers are as follows: President, Dee Wennerstrom; Membership, Rick Smith; Programs, Nadine World; Wagon Master, Ed Bauman; Treasurer, Linda Huber; and Secretary, Bruce Block. Dee asked if there were any nominations from the floor, there were none, so the above people will be our 2018 officers. Doug then discussed our 2018 Chairpersons/reps volunteers. They were as follows: Newsletter, John Huber; Webmaster/ Directory, Bob Poole; Meeting Refreshments, Mary Faux; Publicity, Sharon Braun; Liaison, Mike Epstein; Welcome Table, Connie Gilland & Rob Wingrove; Greeter, Iris Lewis; Sunshine, open; 50/50 Drawing, the St. Clair's & the Moore's; and Shirts & Hats Sales, Joanie VanWickle. Dee discussed the need for Club members to step up and volunteer for jobs, and to host or co-host rallies.

Doug then introduced Security Chief Tim Moy. Tim gave an interesting update on Security's operation/RV related rules, and RV lots information. He gave a summary of his background as an officer and manager for the Orange County Sheriff's Office. The presentation included discussions of the following topics: oversight of the RV lots (Francis Rangel is the contact – 949-268-2284); the process for obtaining a spot; the current waiting list (shortly only 3 will be on the list); removal of commercial vehicles and personal vehicles; RV lot upgrades (Lot A 2019 slurry application, Lot B gate update, and consideration of electrical updates); the need to keep the lots clean (pick up debris, don't leave wheel chocks at your site when you leave); space assignments (vehicle size, boats); on lot maintenance issues (report problems or concerns); the enforcement of rules (concern for unaccompanied vendors, the right to appeal any fine if you believe it was improper); the 2018 fee which was set at \$320; and if any suspicious behavior is observed in the lots, call Security (949-580-1400).

Tim then took member's questions and comments. Ernie Reynolds suggested members install solar powered auto – sensing lights on their RVs for added security. Several lot citations that members received were discussed. Tim said you should appeal any citations you consider to be inappropriate. Also, members asked Tim to fix several items. Tim Moy appears to care about doing a good job, and he cares for us and is willing to help out when possible. If you have any lot related or RV community related problems, contact our Security Liaison Mike Epstein (949-768-5159).

The 50/50 drawing was held and we had 3 winners. Dee adjourned the meeting at 7:55pm.



## Hosted by the Escapees Solos January 17-24, 2018



Approximately 240 miles from Laguna Woods, this desert destination is perfect during the winter and spring and is located just 22 miles over the Arizona border. Wheeler and Escapees member Carol Preimesberger has invited us to join them for their annual outing, camping on FREE Bureau of Land Management (BLM) land.

This is the time of year when this small desert town hosts a huge "swap meet" with vendors selling a variety of merchandise scattered everywhere plus the BIG TENT open from January 20-28 with everything you can think of for your RV. If you've never experienced this event, it must be on your bucket list. In town, there are three good hardware stores with a good supply of RV stuff. The Gambler has new and used RV parts and appliances. In the back, they have bins and bins of miscellaneous RV parts that you can look through. Then there is K&B Tools, Quartzsite's version of Harbor Freight.

This rally will be VERY informal – no sign ups, no money up front. While the Solos will be there all week, you don't have to go for the entire week – come and leave whenever you choose. If "boon docking" (no hookups) is not your thing, you could choose to stay at one of the local RV parks with hookups. One that the Wheelers stayed at in 2016 was Rose RV Park. If you choose to do that, you need to make your own reservations there (or some other park) by calling them at 405-306-2309. There are plenty of other RV parks in town or nearby. Early reservations are recommended. For those boon docking, there are nearby places where you can dump (if you have to) and buy water at a reasonable price.

BUT, the fun will be out at the Plumosa BLM camp, just a few short miles off the I-10. Cross the Arizona border, go approx. 22 miles and take Exit 17 (the first of two Quartzsite exits); turn left. To I-95 north and turn left. Go to Plumosa Road and turn right. Just past mile marker 2.2 on the left side look for the big yellow happy face (Solo's logo) and turn left; go about 100 yards and you will see the camp on the left side of the road. You'll see lots of big yellow smiling face signs and flags. Park anywhere near the group. Then, just look for Carol Preimesberger, who will be there to welcome you.

There's going to be lots of good fun and camaraderie. The Escapees provide coffee and breakfast every morning, a hamburger/hot dog cookout one evening, a great BBQ beef dinner one evening, "burn your own meat" one night (you bring meat and a dish to share), wine and appetizers one night, dancing to a live band one afternoon, a campfire every night, and much more. Bringing a donation of fruit or extra water for coffee would be appreciated. The food cost for those partaking will be approximately \$20/person. Dinner is on your own two nights. There will be a presentation regarding RV refrigeration on Thursday afternoon that should be very educational. More information will follow.

There will also be a CARE (Continuing Assistance for Retired Escapees) auction where rally attendees are requested to bring something to auction off; i.e., RV related items, tools, books, etc. The money goes to CARE which is an Escapees nonprofit care center located in Livingston, TX which provides a safe haven with professional assistance at affordable prices for Escapees members who are not able to travel any longer because of age or health problems. It is not a nursing home. More information can be provided if you are interested.




