The following is a TECH TIP:

The author is a retired engineer and shared the following:

For those of you who have clear plastic handrails, especially illuminated ones, do not clean the handrails with **hand sanitizer or wipes that contain alcohol.** These products can cause the handrails to crack or craze (produce a network of fine cracks) because of what's called environmental stress corrosion in plastic. The handle will be affected even if you wipe off/dry the handle after you apply the alcohol sanitizer and wipes. The plastic absorbs the alcohol immediately.

It's suggested that you wipe the handles with plain or antimicrobial soap and water, or wipes that do not contain alcohol or other hydrocarbon solvents. Continual use of the non prescribed hand sanitizers and wipes will cause cracks and crazes and could eventually cause the handrails to fail.
