Special bus excursions are planned to museums, shopping centers, and other locations outside of the Village. RV WHEELERS 3/9/17 GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Officers present included Dee Wennerstrom, Doug Gibson, and Bruce Block. Dee called the meeting to order at 6:40pm. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Joanie Van Wickle. March birthdays and anniversaries were recognized. Frank Van Wickle singing a funny camping related song is getting to be a regular event at our meetings. Frank, with the help of the members and song sheets led the group singing "There's a Few Things We Should Do" to the tune of "Red River Valley." A good time was had by all. Dee recognized 8 guests, some of whom joined the Club (welcome to Henry and Donna Szostak and Sherry Pierce).

Mike Epstein gave a Security Update. Mike requested member feedback on the operation of Lot A dump station. Repairs have been conducted recently, but the drain had not been working correctly. Is the drain now working? Mike met with Security Manager Tim Moy. 56 RV's are now on the waiting list for spots in Lot A or Lot B. There are now 19 second units and 14 commercial vehicles in the lots and all these will probably be removed to make room. The rules will be reviewed to see if other vehicles should be removed. A field trip is planned to spot units which should be removed from the lots.

Sharon Braun and Pattie Crist discussed the Pala Casino March RV rally. All spaces are filled. Twenty rigs should be attending. There are 16 rigs signed up for the Santee Lakes rally. The May rally will be at the Ramona Oaks RV Resort. It is a 5 day rally running from May 21 (Sunday) to May 26 (Friday) costing \$250. A flyer was contained in the March Newsletter. We need help co-hosting this rally and other rallies later in the year. Please volunteer.

Ron Zimmerman gave a report on the survey we conducted regarding future rally planning. Ron focused on the level of member participation on planning and implementing rallies. Ron presented recommendations on 3 levels of member participation for rallies. The first is what we now do, which means everything is planned and organized by the Club (Rally Master and Rally Hosts). The second is similar, but more input is provided by participating members (where, what, when, and dates). The third involves smaller rallies initiated and planned by members. Ron gave the example of a rally to visit Vista Train Museum. These mini rallies would be publicized by the Club and may only involve 5 or 6 rigs. Other survey results discussing survey findings will be presented at the April general meeting.

Doug handed out information from the Disaster Task Force listing what should be in a disaster supply kit, taking care of a pet, and storage of emergency supplies. Doug then introduced J.D. of JD's Vehicle Services to discuss the important points on our rigs to cover when getting ready for summer trips. JD suggested seeing a repair facility for a professional rig inspection. Questions on generators and water system sanitizing were answered. He stressed how there is a great variation in the design of RVs. Mike Epstein summarized the checks required on rig electrical systems, batteries, water system, and wheels/tires.

Dee mentioned that the PC Club is having a workshop covering electronics on the road. Our next meeting will have a program discussing fire safety in RVs. In June, the Club will have a Luau. We will coordinate who brings what food to the potluck. Dee announced that Joanie Van Wickle will take over the sale of Club hats and shirts at the meetings. There were 3 winners to the 50/50 drawings.

Thanks to Roe Noonan and all her helpers for the snacks, set-up, and clean-up after the meeting.

The meeting was adjourned by 7:45pm. Respectfully submitted, Bruce Block, Secretary.

- Planned 4 to 7-day group rallies, within a reasonable driving range of the Village. Also have some week to 2-week trips further afield with planned or spontaneous activities at destination planned by those who attend
- Monthly meetings with guest speakers with knowledge of RV maintenance, repair, and road rules plus social time and camaraderie
- Informative website and monthly club newsletter
- Resource Guide of member recommended RV maintenance, repair, supplies, and parts dealers
