Time is running out for seniors to get a \$10 lifetime pass to parks WELDON B. JOHNSON

Folks age 62 and older who love America's national parks and monuments can purchase a lifetime pass for \$10, but that bargain won't last much longer.

The cost of a National Park Service lifetime pass will increase to \$80, but just when that price hike will occur is unclear.

The senior pass offers lifetime admission to more than 2,000 recreation sites managed by the Bureau of Land Management, Bureau of Reclamation, Fish and Wildlife Service, Forest Service, National Park Service and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Pass holders also get 50 percent off certain National Park Service fees, including camping, swimming, boat launch and other services.

At \$10, the pass is an incredible bargain. At \$80, it's still a great deal. Admission to Grand Canyon National Park, for example, is \$30 for seven days.

June Vista Outing-No Host

We're trying something a little different as suggested by some of the results of our recent survey and Ron Zimmerman has done all the legwork. The Antique and Steam Engine Museum in Vista is having their fully operational annual event on June 24 & 25 at their 55-acre site in Vista; you can come a couple of days before and/or stay a couple of days after. The camping fee, *dry camping only*, is \$ 60; doesn't matter if you stay two days or 5 days, the fee is the same. This fee includes dry camping from June 22 till June 27. The fee is paid, by each rig, when you arrive. The fee includes the camping and entry to the Museum for the weekend. (see details on following page).

The campground has a free dump station with water. Not usable from 9:00am to 6:pm on Saturday and Sunday (Show days) Available all day on non-show days. Friday night they offer a three-course hot dog dinner, for a small cost, on the food court. This is followed by a free movie in the blacksmith building. How good can it get!

On Saturday and Sunday morning they offer a full breakfast, for a small cost, in the Assembly building. Usually from 7:00am to 9:00am.

RV WHEELERS MAY 11, 2017 GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Officers present included: Dee Wennerstrom; Doug Gibson; Ed Bauman; and Bruce Block. The meeting started at 6:10pm with Dee asking Suzanne Conran to lead the Pledge of Allegiance. Dee then introduced four guests: Dan &Tami Curtis; and Roslyn & Ron Ginnis, noting the Curtis' had joined. At 6:15pm, pizza was served. A number of pizzas of several varieties were consumed by hungry members.

At 6:45pm, Dee introduced Randy Harper, a retired Battalion Fire Chief, to talk about "Fire Safety for RV's." He first talked about Orange County's 17 fire stations, and how highly qualified paramedics are now stationed on the fire engines. Randy described how the fire authority has much experience with manufactured homes which are a lot like RV's in construction. He then went into RV safety describing the need for working, and regularly tested alarms (smoke, CO, and propane). RV's are considered light weight construction, with high potential for fire, with the possibility for heavy smoke. The number one hazard is cooking. We should have a plan for putting out the fire, for getting out if necessary, and calling 911 quickly. There is a possibility for a fire burning between you and the exit door. Window exits and other doors should be reviewed before any problem occurs. Two fire extinguishers located near the main exit door are recommended. Extinguishers should be shaken and checked for pressure every 6 months. A disaster kit and another fire extinguisher should be located in your car or truck. RV electrical panel and other equipment should be checked regularly.

RV inspection and regular maintenance was recommended. Tire inspections and proper inflation can prevent blowouts, loss of control and damage under the RV. Brakes dragging and overheating can cause tire fires which could burn the RV. When parked at a camp site, watch that campfires are not too close to the RV or an awning. When using a generator, make sure your CO detector is working. Members thanked Randy for his informative and interesting presentation,

At 7:40, Dee thanked members for bringing "Blessing Bags" to help the homeless. Also, she thanked Bill and Pattie Crist for making the coffee and lemonade and running the setup and pizza portion of this meeting, Elsie and Dave St.Clair for running the 50/50, and Joanie Van Wickle for selling Club shirts/hats. Next month we will have the Luau Meeting. The Club will provide the meat, and members should bring a potluck item. Members should call Dee if they are coming so we can get an accurate count of attendees. The 50/50 drawing was held and we had 3 winners.

The upcoming no-host rally to the Vista Antique and Steam Engine Museum was discussed by Ron Zimmerman. Details on this June 22 to 27 outing were sent to members in the May Newsletter. The show will be on June 24 and 25. Those coming should email or call Ron so he knows how many rigs will be attending. In other rally news, Doug said the May 21 to 26 Ramona Oaks rally now has 12 rigs signed up. Ed reported the September Chula Vista rally flyer will be coming out soon. There is always great interest in this rally, so if you want to go, send in your money shortly after the flyer comes out. There has been a change in the November rally. It is now planned to go to Desert Hot Springs. The December rally will again be with the CDRV's at Chula Vista. This has been a very good rally, so consider it early and send in your money when the flyer comes out.


