Rv'ing Tip Glove Up for RV Dumping By Jim Twamley in the <u>RV Travel Newsletter</u>

I used to empty my sewer tanks bare-handed. I didn't like wearing the traditional type dish gloves because they are too bulky and I wasn't crazy about latex gloves because they would easily tear. A few years ago I was strolling down the aisles at Harbor Freight (a tool store) when I noticed nitrile disposable gloves. Since I was building kitchen cabinets for my sister-in-law I decided to pick up a box for working with stain and varnish. These gloves are thin enough that your sense of touch is not hindered and tough enough to stand up to mild chemical exposure. I liked them so much I decided to keep a box near my sewer clean-out compartment. Now I glove up before dumping and peel off the gloves and toss them into the trash when I'm done. They are coated with powder so they are easy to slip on and off. I like the extra-large size even though I normally wear size large because putting them on is easier.

You can also use these gloves for changing oil, painting, washing, waxing and many other applications. These gloves are available at big box stores and pharmacies. **Amazon carries the gloves** at a good price. Working with RVers hand-in-glove. *—Jim Twamley, Professor of RVing*

RV WHEELERS GENERAL MEETING MINUTES – FEBRUARY 9, 2017

The annual Soup and Salad meeting was held. Officers present included: Dee Wennerstrom; Doug Gibson; Linda Huber; Ed Bauman; and Bruce Block. The meeting was called to order by Dee at 6:25pm. Dee asked Bob Batchelor to lead us in the Pledge of Allegiance. Member wedding anniversaries for February were recognized. Pat and Roe Noonan are celebrating their 50th anniversary and were cheered on by the crowd. People with February birthdays were then recognized and asked to stand and be recognized. The Noonans, all the birthday celebrants, and members who wore their blue Club shirts were asked to be first in the food line.

The Soup and Salad meal was a great success and about 80 people were fed. Food included a number of excellent soups and salads, breads and cornbreads, and a dessert table to rival some casinos. Members expressed their gratitude to all who provided the food, and to all who helped setup and clean up the clubhouse.

Dee started the formal meeting at 7:05pm. Dee mentioned there were some pictures from the December Holiday Party in the lobby. She thanked John Gee again for taking the pictures. Doug was introduced to talk about future meeting programs. Prior to the discussion, he handed out flyers from the City of Laguna Woods titled, "Where Does My Property Tax and Sales Tax Go?", and "Comprehensive Annual Financial Report." Doug then discussed future meeting program planning. A committee has been initiated to research future programs. The Board feels that we need to plan a series of interesting programs to improve meeting attendance and to provide timely information to members. Good suggestions from members will be appreciated. Doug then asked Frank Van Wickle to lead us in singing an RV related campfire song titled "The Manual is Somewhat Unclear." Using handout sheets, the crowd sang along and had a good time. After, Doug reminded us to continue saving pull-tabs to be donated to the Loma Linda Center.

Dee introduced Patricia and Neal Wedehase who are new Club members. She asked them to tell us about themselves, their background, and their interests. Next, she introduced Laurie and Mark Tate who discussed themselves including their purchase of a new RV. It was suggested we keep Wheeler membership applications in our RV's to handout to our Lot A and Lot B neighbors. Dee then said Jim and Suzanne Conran will be selling their condo and moving back East this summer. By June, we need a volunteer to take over Suzanne's job of selling Club shirts and hats at meetings. Our new 2017 Club Directory is now finished and available on our web site in the "members only section." Thanks to Bob Poole for doing such a good job on the Directory. Any corrections are to be sent to Bob Poole.

Dee introduced Ron Zimmerman who is looking into surveying members about future rallies and what to do to offer more to our members and possible future members. With help from John Huber, an on-line survey will be sent to members to get their input. The survey consists of 10 questions. It will use "Survey Monkey" to tabulate results. Ron described many of our present rallies as "one size fits all." Members may want to go greater distances, or different RV park locations. They may want to attend a rally for the entire period, or to stay for only for a few days. Individuals may want to set up a smaller rally or at different types of parks (eg. dry camping). Combining rallies/trips with other clubs or organizations (FMCA, Good Sam, etc.) would provide other options. ALL MEMBERS ARE ASKED TO PLEASE FILL OUT THE SURVEY, a link to the survey will be sent to everyone in an email. We need your input to provide superior camping experiences.

Wagon Master Ed Bauman discussed having smaller rallies on our schedule along with our large rallies. Some smaller rally ideas included dry camping at places like Borrego Springs and at the Vista area. Ed asked for volunteers to host some of our upcoming rallies including: Ramona Oaks (May 7-12); Oceanside Elks (July); and Chula Vista (September 16-21). Ed and Dee will host the proposed Santee Lakes rally (April 24-28). Experience is not necessary to host a rally as plenty of help and guidance are available. We need your help, please volunteer. Sharon Braun reported that our new rally site of Pala Casino (March 12-16) now has 22 rigs signed up. CDRVer Mario Citro is running the March 26-31 rally at Emerald Desert. Reservations for that rally are now closed.

Mike Epstein reported on a Security meeting with Tim Moy. Fifty people are waiting for a spot in Lots A or B. A committee is being proposed which will include some of our people and some Security people. The committee will look at the RV's, boats, 2nd vehicles, etc. presently stored in the lots and match the size of the units with the spaces. This should improve space utilization. Unkept vehicles, 2nd vehicles, and cars could be removed with the objective of freeing up space for the waiting RV's and boats. Mike reported to Tim Moy that rats are still a problem, and the sewer is still overflowing in Lot A.

We had a successful 50/50 drawing with 4 prizes given out. The meeting was adjourned before 8:00pm.

Need Answers to RV Problems-Here's some places to look:

<u>RV.net</u>: A lot of forums where you can ask questions and get answers for knowable RVers. It's owned by Good Sam and has some advertising. Individual forums for different types of RVs, camping, beginners, general, technical, and full-timing. Lots of good information and they're all searchable.

<u>iRV2 Forum</u>: This is a popular forum with a lot subsets including forums focused on manufacturers of popular products. It covers everything for the beginner to the most advanced users. It includes areas for chassis, power trains, RV systems, and lifestyles. You can subscribe to some of the forums and receive daily emails with new topics and answers.

<u>Escapees Discussion Forum</u>: This is part of the Escapees club, but you don't have to be a member to use the forums. Again, a lot of detailed information but with a focus on full-timing. Includes topics such as internet on the road, work camping, budgets and volunteering.

I think you can find answers to any questions you have about your rig or Rving in general in these forums. If you have any additional resources, please let me know. If you want to know about RV parks in an area the best website is <u>RV Park Reviews</u>, which is reports from rvers about the parks they are staying at, like Yelp works.

Approx. 85 miles from Laguna Woods, via the I-5 South to CA-78. A great time to enjoy some nice weather. In a beautiful setting, this is a new venue for us, but one we think you will enjoy. The park is under new management, newly renovated, and very nicely done.

No concrete pads here, wild turkeys run throughout the park and many bird species including red-headed woodpeckers and baby ducks rest here. 




