FOR THOSE WHO LIKE TO PLAN AHEAD

The WOW! Ladies of the RV Wheelers are planning our October rally waaay ahead of time since this is a very popular winter spot with campers. We are going to Aqua Caliente County Park for six nights, starting October 12. You could join us for the entire stay or however few nights you want. Aqua Caliente which is in Julian, but where the club has stayed at least 3 different times when we were visiting Anza Borrego State Park, is about 45 minutes away from Borrego Springs. It's about 150 miles from home via the I-8. It is a San Diego County Regional Park and very reasonable. \$33 for full hookhups; \$29 partial hookups (+ \$5 reservation fee for all reservations). We last stayed there in 2013, but everyone seemed to enjoy it. You will love the natural mineral hot springs! Right now there are not a lot of full hookup spots available, but we don't advise waiting too long to book your spot.

This desert destination is perfect during the winter and spring and is located near the south end of Anza-Borrego Desert State Park. Best known for its geothermally heated springs, it attracts visitors eager to soak in the soothing mineral waters. Two naturally fed pools provide different ways of enjoying the mineral water: A large outdoor pool is a natural 90 degrees, and the indoor therapeutic spa is heated to 102 degrees and outfitted with Jacuzzi jets. In addition to the pools, spectacular vistas await us while lounging around camp, hiking the miles of trails that meander through the park's canyons, or taking a leisurely sunset or sunrise walk. Those wishing to take a drive into Borrego Springs can enjoy presentations by volunteer naturalists at the State Park Visitor Center outside town or join in one of the nature walks led by park staff. You could also bird-watch or even go shopping or have lunch in the little village of Borrego Springs.

Since the County of San Diego requires full payment ahead, booking even just 10 sites would require quite an outlay from our treasury, so we are asking those who want to go to book their sites individually and let us know which site you have booked. So far we have booked 6 spots around the 70-74 area. In the next couple of days, we will be sending out more information about the campground and the requirements so you can take a look. If you book this far out and later have to cancel, the cancellation fee is pretty nominal if you cancel 30 days or more ahead. Take a look at sdparks.org for more information.
