Security and Community Access Committee Report-Mike Epstein/Doug Gibson

Highlights from the October 22 meeting include:

Lot A Resurfacing: Everyone should be back in their old spaces by now. There are still some RVs scattered about the Village, but since we were told the job would not be completed until the end of October, there will be no NOVs (Notice of Violation) and no RVs towed until then.

Gate Access Schedule: New gate arms will be installed in the following order - Gates 1 & 14, 2 & 7, 3 & 8, 4 & 9, 10 & 11. Should all be done by January/February of next year – MAYBE. RV Lot Vacancies: 36 in Lot A and 7 in Lot B. Two on the Waiting List

New ID Cards: Chuck Holland will be rolling out new ID cards soon. The new cards are of the "proximity" type. This means rather than sliding you card through a slot, you will touch your card to the reader, New residents will be issued the proximity cards and the rest of us will get them over the next two years. Your magnetic stripe card will continue to work during the transition.

Agua Caliente County Park – by Dee Wennerstrom

Five of our 9 RVs met up at the Laguna Hills Mall parking lot and traveled down the I-5 and over to the I-8, stopping at the summit (which was 4000 feet) at the Golden Acorn to fuel up and have a little lunch. Then another 60 miles down to Ocotillo and onto the S2 to Agua Caliente for a total of 182 miles. Ron Zimmerman decided to take the road less traveled – the curvy road through Julian, but 50 miles shorter. Yep, Ron was all set up and waiting for us when we got there.

Our first day was spent setting up and then relaxing until Happy Hour when we met to discuss our travels. It was then that we began to worry about one of our ladies who had just pulled into the Golden Acorn as we were leaving, assuring us that she would soon be on her way. But by 4 pm we were getting a little worried so drove to the only spot around with cell coverage (4 miles away) to call her. The next day the group drove into Julian for a little shopping and lunch and then of course to buy pies. That was a nice trip. That evening we had use of the club house and so enjoyed playing our standby game, "5 to the Left", leaving a couple of our ladies \$12 richer.

RV WHEELERS OCTOBER 11, 2018 GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Officers present included: Dee Wennerstrom; Rich Smith; Nadine World; and Bruce Block. Thank you to all who provided snacks, cookies, and cakes before the meeting. Pat Noonan led us with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Nadine introduced new Village resident and potential Club member Ron Nelson who discussed maintenance of our RVs. Ron is experienced in all phases of RV exterior, inside, and appliance maintenance. Ron and his wife full timed and have RVed over a number of years. He has practical experience as well as his work experience. A detailed summary of his discussion will be sent out to Wheelers shortly. Following is a brief summary of his talk. The talk was enjoyed by all Wheelers and we thanked him for the important information he presented.

Exterior Concerns – The importance of preventing water leaks was discussed. Roofs need to be inspected looking for cover cracks, caulking issues, and A/C coil dirt buildup. Side joints and window caulking inspections are important. Side delamination (due to water intrusion) must be prevented. The importance of regularly looking for moisture inside the rig and in the storage compartments was stressed. Preventing bug, mice, and rat intrusion was discussed (eg. checking engine compartment).

Interior Concerns - After a major trip, it is wise to check for water leaks at the plastic pipe joints. Disinfecting the inside surfaces and mattress once a year is recommended. Silicone spray can be used on the window tracks and the toilet sliding seal. Alarms batteries and operation should be checked, and appliances performance should be regularly checked. Propane lines should be checked for leaks (bleed down test). Refrigerator performance can be enhanced by keeping it moderately full, and by using a small battery powered fan inside it to circulate air. For best A/C operation, put unit on auto, and run at high speed. Also, clean filters and clean the coil (foam spray) on the roof.

A question and answer session followed. Dee then introduced visitors and three new members. The 50/50 drawing followed, with 2 winners.

The meeting ended at 7:55pm. Respectfully submitted, Bruce Block, Secretary.
