
President's Message <u>FALL RV CLEAN UP</u> <u>DONATIONS WANTED</u>

Our Wagon Master will be putting out the assignment list in the next month or so, so be thinking where you'd like to take us. We have a job description for the position of Rally Host which she would be happy to send you.



Rally Hosting 101 The Good, the Bad, and the Ugly

(or how to have a good time & make new friends)



As **Rally-Host**, it is your option as to which campground, what activities and meals are scheduled, and making the schedule as simple as you want. Extras are limited to your desires, energy, time, experience and imagination. The Wagon Master will provide a job description and guidelines for rally hosts. There are only a few must-dos:

Volunteer to **host** a **rally** at a time and place of your choosing. Decide on a camp ground at least six months in advance and make reservations. Choose an assistant or two to help out.

Make sure the price includes all taxes, fees and costs due to the campground as well as any club-provided food or activities. All fees are to be collected in advance of the rally.

Make cancellation policy of the park clear.

Prepare a flyer at least three months in advance.

The club treasurer can arrange to pay deposit with the club's credit card. All rallies are to be financially self-funded with the club being reimbursed for any pre-paid deposit.

The club has a variety of supplies which can be used for the rally.


The Wagon Master will provide you with any information and help you need.

Death Valley'49ers 70th Annual Encampment Death Valley, CA

This is a "no host" rally

We would like to invite you to join some Wheelers on a trip to Death Valley November 4th - 10th, 2019 during the Death Valley '49ers Encampment. Some of us are going directly there from the Lone Pine/Bishop rally; some are coming directly from Laguna Woods Village (about 300 miles). Some may be dividing the drive up into a two-day trip. We are staying at Sunset Campground, across the street from the Furnace Creek Ranch. Furnace Creek is approximately 165 miles from the Bishop campground where the RV Wheelers will be staying, via 395 S & 190 E.

<u>Encampment events</u> begin November 4th and run until November 10th, but you can come in early and stay longer if you want. This week-long Western heritage festival includes old-time and western-style music, fiddlin' and pickin' contests, historic character reenactments, history presentations, Invitational Western Art Show, craft show, golf tournament, wheelbarrow race, a pioneer costume contest, 4X4 tours, wagon train and horse parades, community breakfasts and the World's Lowest 1849 Poker Tournament.

Camping at the National Park Service Sunset Campground, right across the street from Furnace Creek Ranch. Pay at automated machine with credit or debit card; \$7 with your Golden Age Passport (for those 62 or older) (\$14 without) which is honored for Bureau of Land Management, Bureau of Reclamation, Corps of Engineers, Fish and Wildlife Service, Forest Service, National Park Service and Tenn. Valley Authority properties. (*Golden Age Passport* was a pass issued by the <u>National</u> <u>Park Service</u> until January 1, 2007. It has been replaced with the *Senior Pass* of the new pass series now called America the Beautiful – National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Pass)

This campground is totally "boondocking", using your generator and being frugal with water usage, it is totally doable. They do have a dump station there for our use for free. Also have bathroom with flushing toilets (no showers though); as well as water stations where you can fill water jugs.

WEATHER

Fall and Spring have the nicest temperatures - days are nice and warm, in the 80's, nights cool, in the 40's or 50's. However, storms can blow in with little notice and change "nice" to threatening! Always be prepared for all kinds of weather conditions.
