

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Research has shown that while over 90% of us want to volunteer, only 1 out of 4 Americans actually do. Did you know there is a relationship between volunteering and improved physical health and cognitive function? Research also shows that volunteers report elevated mood and less depression, and that volunteers report increased social interactions and social support, better relationship quality, and decreased loneliness. So, if most of us want to volunteer, and we believe it is good for us, why aren't more of us volunteering?

Our club takes great pride in the role volunteering has played in our history. We believe that volunteers are virtuous, kind and essential to the health of our club. Volunteering is a great way to meet like-minded, motivated, positive people. Volunteers fundamentally increase our ability to achieve our objectives and advance the social mission of our organization.

We've found the most common reason for not volunteering is lack of free time, which is interesting because retirees (who presumably have more free time) do not volunteer at higher rates than people ages 35 to 44 (those most likely to have young children at home and be employed).

Another very common reason is that people don't think the jobs are meaningful or purposeful. While motivation to volunteer can vary by age, older volunteers are more likely to be motivated to volunteer by personal gratification and having a meaningful experience.

Some people say they don't volunteer because no one asked them to; not so with our club. We're always asking! We want our volunteers to feel included in the goals of our club and know your work (even though unpaid) is valued and appreciated.

Please consider being a volunteer camp host or sitting on our Board or as a chair person.

We had a good time visiting the San Diego Area with 13 RV's with 24 Wheelers attending the rally. We arrived on September 16 and left September 21. Thanks to Roe Noonan for helping so much in co-hosting the rally. The traditional arrival night hors d'oeuvres potluck went off in style as attendees provided numerous delicious items. Highlights included: Tuesday's poolside entertainment and "Five to the Left" competition in the evening (where Irmina Gomez went home a big winner); Wednesday's going to the Galley for a breakfast special and an evening potluck dinner; and a series of trips to the City and even a well-attended harbor boat tour. Breakfasts were provided by the hosts on three days. A number of the attendees used the rally to rest, and to get their rigs washed and waxed. The pool and hot tub drew Wheelers out of their rigs to enjoy the water and the sun. Pictures from the rally are included in this Newsletter. However, later in the week we were notified that Chula Vista RV Resort was officially told to stop their operation on February 1, 2019 and exit the property by March 1 (they leased the property from the Port of San Diego all these years). The 35 years of operation will stop so a convention center and other commercial businesses can be built on the property. It is not clear if, when, and where a new Chula Vista RV park will be built. For those of us who have visited the existing park for years, this situation stinks.

UNOFFICIAL CAMP OUT TO DEATH VALLEY – 49'ers Encampment

Two hours west of Las Vegas in Southern California lies a desert. Not only a desert, but the largest national park in the continental United States at roughly 3.4 million acres. When you really want to get away, you could hardly pick a more remote place than Furnace Creek in the heart of Death Valley National Park.

Death Valley National Park is one of the most overlooked National Parks due to would be visitors assuming that it's just a massive landscape filled with nothing but sand and cactus. I mean really, who actually wants to visit a desert? A few of us Wheeler Members are going to do just that this November. The 49'er Encampment Days is officially November 4-11 this year.

2016 was my third trip to Death Valley. Getting there revealed a lot of beautiful scenery, high and winding roads, and the biggest boulders ever. Our main reason for the trip was to attend the 67th Annual Death Valley Encampment. We went a little early to be able to have a good spot at the BLM campground directly across from the Furnace Creek Ranch called **Sunset Campground**. At \$8 a night with the senior Golden Age pass, it's a deal. They do have restrooms (no showers) and two dump stations, but NO hookups. BLM Campgrounds here are big and well laid out, plus this one is right in the center of the park. Other than in the heat of summer, this is a good place to stay. Usually November is pleasant – in the 70s during the day - but can get really cold at night (maybe in the 40s). In 2016, however, it was in the 90s most days and never got below 68 at night most of the time we were there. There were a couple of windy days, but it was mostly delightful.

The Encampment features gold panning, a poker tournament, fiddlers' contest, a Western art show, live music, horseshoe contests, arts and crafts, and golf tournament and a big breakfast. One of the highlights of the Encampment took place on Friday, when a wagon train and horseback riders arrived after their 1849 re-enactment of the original travelers' arduous trek across the valley. Two days before they actually arrived at Furnace Creek Ranch, they invited our group to drive out to the middle of the desert where they would camp for the night and join them for a wagon train-style dinner: food cooked in cast iron pots, covered with coals, with horses and mules quietly grazing nearby. This great meal was followed by REAL cowboy music around the campfire under the light of the moon. Even having to drive about 10 miles over a dirt road in the middle of the desert, I think this was the highlight of the trip.

During our time there, our group visited the many interesting spots in the Valley. Unfortunately, Scotty's Castle has been closed since the flooding in 2015 and won't be open until 2020. Some of us drove out to Ash Meadows Wildlife Refuge where an endangered species of fish live called the Devil's Hole pupfish. These fish live in a geothermal aquifer-fed pool within a limestone cavern. They are considered the rarest fish on earth, numbering only about 200.

Death Valley is rich in history, including some pretty crazy tales. People come from all over to see Death Valley's unique and colorful geology that exists nowhere else in North America but here. If you haven't been, plan a trip – maybe join us!!

Afterward, we are going directly to the Wheeler rally at Sam's Spa in Desert Hot Springs, so should be a great trip.

COME CELEBRATE THE BEAUTY OF THE DESERT!!

Now those who still work can join us for the weekend. We will leave on Friday, October 12 (check in time is 2 PM) and come home on Thursday, October 18 or any day you choose (check out time is Noon). The cost is \$33/nite for full hookups plus a \$5 reservation fee (\$29 + \$5 for partial hookups). Cabins are also available. PLEASE NOTE YOU HAVE TO MAKE YOUR OWN RESERVATIONS. Try to get in the area of sites 70-90 as that is where your hosts plan to be.

The park is a 910-acre San Diego County Park approximately 150 miles from Laguna Woods. Best known for its geothermally heated springs, it attracts visitors eager to soak in the soothing mineral waters. Two naturally fed outdoor pools and an indoor therapeutic spa which is heated to 102 degrees and outfitted with Jacuzzi jets. This desert destination is perfect during the winter and spring and is located near the south end of Anza-Borrego Desert State Park.

Those wishing to take a drive into Borrego Springs (about 45 miles away) can enjoy presentations by volunteer naturalists at a very unique Visitor Center outside town or join in one of the nature walks led by park staff. You could also bird-watch or even go shopping or have lunch in the little village of Borrego Springs or drive into Julian.

REMEMBER, YOU HAVE TO MAKE YOUR OWN RESERVATIONS: Those wishing to go need to call 858-565-3600 to make reservations (or you can do it on-line at www.sdparks.org). Anza-Borrego Desert State Park® has been named an International Dark Sky Park! This recognition for efforts in protecting and interpreting the dark skies over the park comes from the International Dark Sky Association (IDA), and will help ensure that dark skies over Anza-Borrego remain an unspoiled resource. The Night Skies in Anza-Borrego are breathtaking spectacles. USA Today selected the Anza-Borrego Desert as one of America's "Top 10 Stargazing Communities in San Diego" because artificial light is at a minimum: At times you can see so many stars at night it is simply overwhelming! Located two hours east of San Diego, the park has long been a favorite of amateur astronomers, and particularly astro-photographers. Dark skies and low humidity combine to make this a stargazer's paradise.
